Meeting Info

The next Patriot Chapter meeting will take place on Friday, November 7, at 7:30 p.m. at the First Parish Unitarian Church in Billerica, MA. The church is located on Concord Road, just as it meets Route 3A (Boston Road) at the Billerica Town Common. The November meeting will be a build session with a business meeting, Show-and-Tell, and a raffle.



It's been a long time since we've featured Kurt Kunze's work on the cover. We're happy to have the opportunity to display his very nicely built 1/72 scale Buccaneer S.2B (Airfix). Kurt added Eduard photo-etch, mainly in the cockpit. Kurt used Vallejo acrylics for the desert pink and OD, with various Gunze shades for other areas. Decals are from the kit. Markings are for RAF in Desert Storm. For more photos of the model, see Page 7.

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Can you believe it's been almost a month since Patcon? I certainly can't. I still have very vivid recollections of hanging out with friends who made the long haul from Virginia and New Jersey to be at Saturday night's reception at the Museum; the all-too-brief conversations with so many guests on the show floor, dashing from one to the next in hopes of quickly catching up with all; looking over often at the seminar area to see a packed and engaged audience; and of course, seeing all the spectacular models on the competition and display-only tables.

By every data point, Patcon was a screaming success. We had our largest number of models (661 in competition, approximately 125 display only), largest attendance (over 450 contestants and attendees combined), over a dozen children at the Make and Take table, most vendor tables (45), and biggest seminar participation (about 100). As good as these numbers are, they're just numbers. What really matters is the show experience, as I described in my intro. Everyone I talked with was smiling ear to ear, telling me how much fun they were having, and the feedback we received after the show was overwhelmingly positive, almost glowing. I'd always rather host a show in which people are happy and thrilled to attend than one with big numbers but lackluster interest. I'm certainly glad we had both but will always prefer the former. Always.

Was the show perfect? No, not at all. We heard that the seminar proximity to the raffle created space and audio conflicts. Some categories packed up requiring moving of models (hard to believe we actually had a space issue but we did). There were a few snafus during the awards ceremony. And there was a judging controversy. The Patcon committee and officers will address all these and more during our "postmortem." I'm looking forward to doing so: while some may question humanity for the bad stuff that happens at shows, I accept the challenges and embrace the opportunities to make things better for our guests the next year.

So let's all take a moment to celebrate another great Patcon and give ourselves a good ol' golf clap. Let's thank the volunteers, judges, seminar presenters, and Museum staff who did so much of the heavy lifting before, during, and after, and who gave up their personal time for the benefit of our guests. Let's thank the vendors who helped add to our model stashes and tool collections. And of course, let's thank those who competed and those who came to see the great artwork on the tables, we're awfully glad they did, and look forward to having them back in 2026!

Minutes from the October Meeting

1. Patcon: What a show!! Thanks to everyone that contributed to making this year's show what it was. There was some controversy, but this is being handled. There were 661 entries in the content from 132 contestants, a marked improvement on 2024, and a total of over 800 models including those on the display only tables. One comment: the timing for the raffle draws and seminars could have been better. There will be a post-show post-mortem meeting to go over all matters regarding the show.

2. The Treasurer delivered the monthly report. The final numbers are still being processed as the various numbers for Patcon are made available.

3. Another Brewery meet is to be held at the Spyglass Brewery in Nashua (September's gathering was skipped) on Saturday, October 18.

4. We can place another order for club shirts following the same conditions as before, providing we can get at least 12 requests.

5. Nominations for the E-Board are open: a slate was presented of the current members except for the Secretary, who will be stepping down. A motion to accept the slate was passed. Austin Clark has offered to serve as the new secretary. Now is the time to step up if you want to run for any of the E-Board positions. The election will take place at the November meeting.

6. Armorcon is coming up along with the Classic Plastic Show, the Hudson Valley event, and GraniteCon shortly thereafter.

7. Round-room intros were given for new members in attendance.

Austin Clark: 1/144 XXXG-01S Shenlong Gundam (Bandai)

Austin built the figure OOB. For paints he used three custom mixes of Vallejo acrylics plus Vallejo Gunmetal and ProAcryl Orange. To achieve the striking color effect, Austin applied a dark base coat and then stippled with a lighter shade using an old brush that he fanned out by smashing it on his desk.



Peter Foti: 1/35 GMC M211 (AVF Club converted)

Peter added a vacuformed hood, soldered brass square tube, and numerous 3D printed details and styrene bits. Paints are AK Interactive acrylics with weathering using oils and enamels. Peter writes, "This is a recreation of the cargo truck from the movie "Sorcerer" (1977). The truck is a Korean War era GMC M211. To build it, I converted an AFV Club M35A2 by scratchbuilding the front end."

Kurt Kunze: 1/72 Blackburn Buccaneer S.2B (Airfix)

The Buccaneer was originally designed in response to the Soviet Union introducing the Sverdlov class of light cruisers. Instead of building a new class of its own cruisers, the Royal Navy decided that it could address the threat posed via low-level attack runs performed by Buccaneers, low enough to exploit the ship's radar horizon to minimise the opportunity for being fired upon. The Buccaneer could attack using nuclear weapons or conventional munitions. During its service life, it would be modified to carry anti-ship missiles, allowing it to attack vessels from a stand-off distance and thus improve its survivability against modern ship-based anti-aircraft weapons.[2] The Buccaneer performed its maiden flight in April 1958 and entered Royal Navy service during July 1962.

The Royal Navy retired the last of its large aircraft carriers in February 1979; as a result, the Buccaneer's strike role was transferred to the British Aerospace Sea Harrier, and the Buccaneers were transferred to the RAF. The last of the RAF's Buccaneers were retired in March 1994 in favour of the more modern Panavia Tornado. The South African Air Force was the only export customer for the type. Buccaneers saw combat action in the first Gulf War of 1991, and the lengthy South African Border War.



Stephen Maire: 1/48 Ki-27 Type 97 Fighter (Hasegawa ex-Mania)

Stephen built the model OOB and painted it with AV and Mig acrylics. For weathering he pre-shaded in black and used Mig panel line wash. Decals are from Kora Models. Markings are for the Royal Thai Air Force, 1942-44..

Codenamed Nate by the Allies, the Nakajima Type 97 was the Imperial Japanese Army Air Force's principal fighter aircraft prior to 1940, and it continued in service well the WW2 years, notably in China against Claire Chennault's AVG where it was outclassed by the P-40, and late in the war when every available aircraft was rushed into combat.. The name Type 97 derives from its acceptance into service during the Imperial Year 2597 (our year 1937). Like many other Japanese warplanes of its time, it was supremely maneuverable, but lightly armed and poorly protected.



Stephen Maire: 1/48 Ki-27 Type 97 Fighter (Hasegawa ex-Mania)

Stephen built the model OOB and painted it with AV and Mig acrylics. For weathering he pre-shaded in black and used Mig panel line wash. Decals are from Kora Models. Markings are for the Republic of China Air Force in 1945.



Declan Petrosky
1/35 M5A1 Stuart (Tamiya)
Declan built the model OOB and painted it with Vallejo acrylics. It was awarded a gold medal and Best Junior at Patcon 2025.

Richard Price: 1/35 Bedford QLB (IBG Models)

Richard built the model OOB and painted it with Vallejo acrylics. Decals are from the kit. Richard writes, "First IBG build for e. Delightfully complex with some interesting part/assembly design. Overall quite pleasing."

At the outbreak of WW2, Bedford (then a subsidiary of General Motors) was contracted by the British War Office to produce a 3 ton 4x4 general service truck. A pilot model was ready in February 1940, and quantity production started in March 1941. Produced from 1941 to 1945, the QL series featured at least six variants configured for various missions. The QLB was a Bofors gun tractor.



Spencer Talmage: 1/35 T-34/76 "ChTZ" 1943 Production Version (Tamiya)

Spencer built the model OOB. For paint he used a combination of Tamiya and Vallejo acrylics. The white wash was achieved via the hairspray chipping technique. Weathering was done with Winsor & Newton oil paints, AK enamel weathering produces, AK Wet Mud, and AK snow sprinkles. The vinyl tracks received a metallic dry brush before pigments and washes were applied. Spencer adds, "1990 boxing of Tamiya's 1975 mold, originally designed to accommodate an RC motor and batteries. Purchased at Old Dominion Open for less than \$5.00"

Patcon 2025 Winners

The numbers are unprecedented: 132 contestants with 661 entries — up 15 contestants and 163 from our previous best showing last year. Add an estimated 150 display-only models for a total of around 800 models in the hangar.

Aircraft led all genres with 208 entries followed by Armor with 125, Automotive with 112, Gundam with 43, Space/Sci-Fi/Anime also with 43, Figures with 40, Vignettes/Dioramas with 35, Ships with 30, Wargaming and Juniors each with 26. Entries in Collections, Miscellaneous and Masters totaled 41.

The largest single category again this year was Aircraft 1/48 Single Engine Prop with 35, followed by 1/35 Tanks through WW2 with 34 and Automotive Showroom Stock with 31. Both Single Engine Prop and Showroom Stock were split as shown in the list below.
