Eric Xu: 1/48 JGSDF Type 10 Main Battle Tank (Tamiya)

Eric built the model OOB and painted it with Tamiya acrylics: NATO Black, JGSDF Brown and Dark Green, Orange and Red. Decals are from the kit. Markings are for the Armored Division, JGSDF Fuji School.

The Type 10 (Hitomaru-shiki sensha) is a Japanese fourth generation main battle tank produced by Mitsubishi Heavy Industries for the Japanese Ground Self Defense Force. It entered service in 2012. Compared with other currently-serving main battle tanks in the JGSDF, the Type 10 is better equipped to deal with anti-tank weapons. The Type 10 started as the TK-X (MBT-X) project, intended to complement and eventually replace the Type 74 and Type 90 tanks in service with the JGSDF.[5] Development began in the 1990s, and production started in 2010-2011.





Eric Xu: 1/48 Bf 109 G-14 (Eduard)

Eric added an Eduard PE cockpit set and Infini lycra for the antenna wire. Paints are Squadron Scale Colors acrylics (RLM 71, 75 and 76). Decals are from the kit. Markings are for a plane flown by Germany's greatest ace, Erick Hartmann, 4./JG 52, Csór, Hungary, November 1944. Hartmann ended his career with 352 victories. Eric's model is done in the same paint scheme as the Bf 109 G-10 at the American Heritage Museum.





John Walker: 1/35 Ersatz Befehlspanzer (Italeri/Academy)

John mounted an Academy Panzer IV turret on an Italeri Bergepanther hull to replicate this one-off vehicle fabricated by the unit maintenance company. The wheels are home-cast. Decals are from the spares box. Paints are Tamiya acrylics with weathering using pastels, powders and pencil lead. Markings are for 653 s.Pz.JGD.Abt., Russia, 1944.





John Walker: 1/35 2.0cm Flakvierting on Bergepanther Ausf. D (Italeri/Tamiya)

John mounted a Tamiya Flakvierting on an Italeri Bergepanther hull. Paints are Tamiya acrylics weathered with pastels, weathering and pencil lead. Decals are from the spares box. Markings are for 653 s.Pz.Jgd. Abt, Russia, 1944. John writes, "This model represents a one-off vehicle fabricated by the unit maintenance company. However, it is not certain that this vehicle actually existed as no photo has ever been found."





Spencer Talmage: 1/72 MiG 15 UTI (Eduard)

Spencer added AK stretch rigging for 1/72 scale. Paints are a mix of Vallejo and Tamiya acrylics including Vallejo metal color for the exterior NMF. For weathering he used Tamiya Panel Line Accent (Brown) and Winsor & Newton oils. Decals are from the kit. Markings are for the Finnish Air Force Fighter Unit 31, late 1960s, one of four MiG-15 UTIs purchased by Finland in 1962. It served until it crashed and was written off in November 1970. It was notable for escorting Czech president Ludvik Svoboda's Il-18 during a state visit to Finland.

Spencer writes, "I originally started this kit to participate in a Cold War group build online, but had issues with decals at the later stages of the build that delayed me until after the deadline. The cockpit interior included ample PE as Eduard kits typically do, and I think this is probably the best cockpit I've done thus far. I'm less happy with the external finish: the oil weathering worked really well to add subtle dirt/grime, but I was a bit clumsy around the canopy, and the paint is much less refined than I'd like. This was a really nice kit, recommended!"



Dave Ruete: 1/48 SHD=2H Shadowhawk (Revell, ex-Takara Tomy)

Dave built the figure mostly OOB, but fabricated the radio antenna from a large paint brush bristle. Camouflage paint is Tamiya NATO Green, NATO Brown and Black, with various other acrylics for details. For weathering Dave used AK NATO tanks filter and wash. Chipping is still in process; powders to be applied after diorama is completed. OOB decals are from the original Fang of the Sun Dougram anime.

Dave writes, "This is the personal BattleMech of Commander Miranda "Needlenose" Sinclair of the Serpent Strike mercenary company, contracted to the Lyran Commonwealth to garrison the planet Stantisya in the year 3028.

"The Shadowhawk, which featured on the cover of the 2nd edition BattleTech rules manual from the boxed set, was one of the original "unseen" mechs in the Battletech Universe. The -2H variant of the Shadowhawk is a 55 ton medium mech, armed with an autocannon, a medium laser, and a 2-cylinder short range missile launcher, as well as a 5-tube long range missile launcher. The Shadowhawk is a venerable design, dating back several hundred years when it was produced by the Star League."





Richard Price: 1/72 Macchi C.200 (AML, from the Kirk collection)

Richard built the model "OOB as much as possible." He writes, "The kit comes with PE, resin parts and a vacuform canopy. I had to rebuild areas at the front/rear wing roots as it was not possible to fit the wings to the fuselage and have the entire cross-section line up. I added a pitot tube and undercarriage hydraulics from Albion telescopic brass tubing; I scratchbuilt bits for the interior of the wheel wells to cover a gaping void.

"For paints, the kit instructions call out specific Humbrol numbers: 140 Italian Camouflage Grey, 141 Light Blue-Grey No. 1, 91 Dark Olive Green No. 2. I don't own any dedicated Italian Air Force paint, so I went with these. Decals are from the kit. Markings: 356a Squadriglia, 21st Gruppo Autonomo CT, Kantemirovka airfield, Russia, November 1942.

"I picked this kit up as it looked like a quick build with only a single sprue and the PE/resin, as well as a few paint/marking schemes in plain green rather than the commonly seen yellow/mottled ones. Simply the worst kit I have ever built. Terrible fit, no locating pins anywhere. As a limited run kit this is to be expected, but this was really much worse than I have encountered elsewhere. The PE/resin/markings are very nice though; I would recommend buying this kit solely for those and using them on someone else's plastic."





Rich Petrie

1/144 RGM-79(G) Slave Wraith (Bandai)

Rich color corrected various parts using Vallejo Mecha Color paints. Decals are from Bandai, G-Rework and SnowFlame.

The RGM-799G) Slave Wraith is a heavily modified RGM-79[G] GM Ground Type mobile suit piloted by Captain Travis Kirkland in the video game Mobile Suit Gundam Side Story: Missing Link. The mobile suit served as the commander's unit for the Slave Wraith special forces team, a secret Earth Federation black ops unit composed of five members, all criminals who were given a choice to have their records wiped clean in exchange for joining the team.





Pip Moss Lockheed P-38J-20-LO (Tamiya)

Aftermarket items include an Ultracast resin seat and Eduard Brassin 500 lb. bombs. The NMF was done using Alclad Aluminum, Duraluminum, White Aluminum, Dark Aluminum and Stainless Steel. Anti-glare OD is Tru-Color acrylic lacquer. Cockpit colors are Mr. Color Interior Green, AK Real Colors Bronze Green, and Tru-Color OD. Brushed pastels were used forweathering and staining. The model depicts "Arkansas Traveler" of the 392nd FS, 367th FG based in northern France during the Fall of 1944. This is another superlative kit with brilliant engineering and near-perfect fit. The only flaws were long sink marks in the tops of both ailerons that had to be filled.





Jamie Michaels: 28mm Ashlynn of Liberty (Privateer Press)

Jamie replaced the Statue of Liberty base with a wooden block to serve as a statue plinth. Paints are P3 Copper and Vallejo Rust Patina. Jamie writes, "The model is a promotional alternate sculpt of the Statue of Liberty for the *Monsterpocalypse* game featuring the Warmachine character."

28mm Dusk Ghosts of Ios Morayne, the Blade of Twilight (Steamforged Games)

Jamie built the figure OOB and painted it with a mix of P3 and Vallejo acrylics for the snow camouflage. The figure depicts a living ensouled losan elf, one of the last survivors of the now defunct Retribution of Scyrah.





Bill Michaels: 1/100 M3 Stuart (Zvezda)

Bill built this gaming model mostly OOB, but added some lead shot inside the hull to give it more weight so it doesn't float on top of land-scaping on the gaming table. Bill writes, "This is a kit from a few years ago, brought in to keep the string of "someone brought an M3 Stuart to show at the meeting" string going for another month. The Zvezda gaming kits are pretty nice little builds. They go together fast, with decent fit, and have enough detail to look the part without being fragile."







Daniel Lovering1/72 GM FM-1 Wildcat (Hasegawa, from the Kirk collection)

[This information pertains to both Daniel's models on this and the next page.]

Daniel built the kits mostly OOB. He used AK Hyper-Thin Elastic Rigging for the radio antenna wires and replaced the tail antenna posts with sections of D'Addario guitar string. Both models were primed with Mr. Surfacer 1500 and painted with Mr. Color acrylic lacquers, and Vallejo Model Air and Tamiya acrylics. Weathering consists of Tamiya Panel Line Accent, and pastels for exhaust stains. Decals are from the kits. Markings for plane no. 3 (this page) are for VC-12 aboard USS Core (Atlantic theatre color scheme). Markings for plane S31 (Page 17) are for VC-33 aboard USS Nassau (Pacific theatre 4-color scheme).

Daniel writes, "These were the first aircraft models I had built since childhood, and I made a lot of mistakes, perhaps the most egregious of which was using the kit decals, which had wrinkled with age and should have been discarded. But I was unable to find third party replacements, so, following the advice of a few club members, I decided to try the kit decals with Micro Liquid Decal Film. That worked well at first, but unfortunately the decals cracked and peeled as they dried. The wing code on S31 was so bad that I removed it and painted it using a homemade stencil instead. Despite these difficulties, I enjoyed the process and look forward to building more aircraft models in the future."

Chris Kizik 1/35 German Train Station (unknown manufacturer)

Chris added roof shingles and Miniart train accessories. Paints the are Vallejo acrylics with MIGAmmo Earth weathering. The propaganda posters on the wall are aftermarket decals. The unit could serve as a diorama base for either American or German vehicles.



Mason Fitch: 1/550 Neue Ziel (Bandai)

Maston built the figure OOB and painted it with Mr. Color acrylic lacquer (sprayed) and Vallejo acrylics hand painted for details.

The AMX-002 Neue Ziel is a space-use prototype mobile armor featured in OVA (Original Video Animation) *Mobile Suit Gundam 0083: Stardust Memory.* It was piloted by the "Nightmare of Solomon," Anavel Gato, a Zeon ace pilot and the series' main antagonist.
